Your Council submits for your consideration its report on the activities of the Society for the twelve months ended 31st July, 1923.

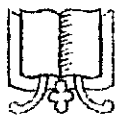
Visits, by members of the Council, were also made to Albert, Mt. Gambier, Millicent, and Balaklava Societies during the year.
