

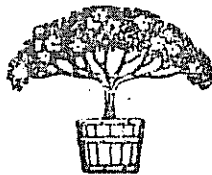

Forty-Fifth Annual Report, 1925-26

To be submitted at the Annual Meeting in the Caledonian Memorial Hall, 379 King William Street, Adelaide, on Tuesday, 20th July, 1926, at 8 p.m.

Gentlemen,

Your Council, at the end of another year in the history of the Society (this time in our own hall) submit the Annual Report and Balance Sheet. During the year just ended, 30th June, 1926, many functions have been held, and much good work has been gone through, but the outstanding feature of 1925-26, the one that looms largest in the minds of the members and fills every one with jubilant feeling, is the fact that we are now occupying "Oor Ain" commodious and well furnished Memorial Hall, befitting the dignity of the Society and the memory of those who fought and fell in defence of their King and Country.

About the Time the Annual Meeting was held **New Hall.** last year, tenders were called for and contract accepted on the 4th August last, the architect and successful tenderer being Messrs. Donald Graham and T. P. Menzies, members of the Society. The 17th October following will always be remembered as a red letter day in the Society's history, when the foundation stone was laid by the Chief, Mr. Andrew D. Young, in the presence of a large number of enthusiastic members and friends.

Opening Ceremony. Saturday, the 27th March last, was fixed for the official opening of the new Hall, and that very important ceremony was duly performed by Past Chief, Mr. Duncan Fraser, S.M. There were nearly 600 members and friends in the hall. On the same occasion Lady Duncan unveiled the Roll of Honor, which adorns the entrance to the hall, and which was presented to the Society by her son, Mr. J. G. Duncan-Hughes, M.H.R., who is a member of the Council.

Since the opening night of the hall, the Council is pleased to tell the members that the hall has been occupied every night, and four nights a week are booked ahead till March next. All other nights till November next are already booked, and rents are satisfactory. £138 18s. 6d. has been received from that source during the first three months.

Notwithstanding that the Register of Members has been revised, and a number of names removed therefrom, our membership, including His Excellency Lord Stonehaven, now stands at 544, being an increase of 71 over last year as follows:—

The sad part of this report is placing on record the names of those members who have passed away. Death has robbed the Society of seven old and respected members of the Society and the community of the State, many of them being widely known in business circles:—they were Messrs. Neil McGilp, Wm. Booth, Alex. Ure, Jas. Cram, P. D. Conley, John Kerr, and Harry J. McKay.

Members will see by the Balance Sheet that we have made good progress during the year just closed, notably in members' subscriptions, which have increased by £99 over last year. The Council express gratitude to Mr. T. E. Barr Smith, who has increased his donation of £500 to £600. To the family of our respected late Chief, Mr. J. W. McGregor, who contributed the £500 promised shortly before he passed away; and to Sir Josiah H. Symon, K.C.M.G., one of the foundation members, for his generous donation of £100 on the day of the opening of the hall. The Council also express their gratitude to others who have contributed according to their means.

Was held at the Palais Royal on the Hallowe'en. 29th October, and proved a greater success than any yet held by the Society; nearly 1,400 applications were made for admission, and that great hall was taxed to overflowing. About 200

children were seated to supper, provided by the Chief and Mrs. Andrew D. Young; the adults were well catered for, and seemed to enjoy themselves.

St. Andrew's Dinner. The Chief presided at this function, which was held at the Grosvenor on the 30th November, and also proved a greater success, from the point of numbers, 120 being present, which shows that the popularity of this evergreen event is gaining more appreciation from members and friends.

Bairns' Class. That the popularity of this class in the new hall is making splendid headway, is shown by the increased number of children who have been enrolled this season under the able tuition of their instructors, Messrs. C. P. Miller, J. Ogg, and Miss Luff as pianiste, who are ably assisted by the Committee, Messrs. J. Thomson and D. M. Dowie, to all of whom the Council are grateful for their good help.

Members' Socials. Three of these Social Evenings have already been held in the new hall, and the way they have been attended and appreciated has led the Council to set apart three other similar ones in August, September, and October; the dates are set out in this month's circular.

Scholarship. The Muirden Scholarship was awarded this year to Miss Margaret M. Leitch, who is making satisfactory progress in her studies. Members are reminded that the Caledonian and Muirden Scholarships will be open for competition to children of Members in November next.

Fete. A fete, promoted by Mrs. Andrew D. Young and lady friends connected with the Society, was held in the new hall on the 14th May, and proved both financially and socially a great success. The fete was opened by His Excellency the Governor-General and Lady Stonehaven, who expressed pleasure at being invited to be present.

The Chief presented His Excellency with an illuminated address of welcome from the members of the Society on the occasion of his first official visit to Adelaide.

The Council would remind you that you are **Building.** now possessors of a fine building, and a valuable asset. Much money has been spent, and more will be required to meet our liabilities, and to achieve success all members should work harmoniously, enthusiastically, and liberally together to meet our necessary expenditure. This can be done successfully with your efforts to double our membership.

The Council are pleased that at **Chief of Council.** their expressed wish the Chief, Mr. Andrew D. Young, has agreed to accept nomination for that important office during the coming year.
